"East Providence's Sabin Point: Its Importance in the History of Narragansett Bay" by Jeffrey Howe

Newman in 1643 and ran the mills at what is now known as Hunt's Mills with Stephen Paine in the late 1600's. Jeff Howe will sort all this for us, bringing

Strategic Plan Six Month Report

Over the past year the East Providence Historical Society developed a three-year Strategic Plan with the expert guidance of David Karoff, Professional Strategic Planning Consultant and Madison (Maddie) Mott, a Master's Degree Candidate in Public Humanities at Brown University. We started implementing the plan in October, 2019 and have just completed our first six months. We are very proud to report on our progress!!

Our Strategic Plan identified five priority areas which are:

1.) Expand Internal Organizational Capacity
Goals: Increase membership; Double the number of active volunteers; Recruit four new board

members; and Work towards hiring a part-time helper.

In the first six months we have listed volunteer opportunities in the Gazette and on our website, found seven new people to participate in volunteer opportunities, made standardized docent packages and provided training, obtained e-mails for membership and sent letters promoting the marker program to 275 owners with buildings registered in the four National Register Districts.

2.) Increase Funding Base

Goals: Increase dues income; Increase open house donations; Increase event income; Offer Open House sponsorship; Implement an Annual Fund campaign; and Raise \$100,000 over three years to establish an Endowment.

In the first six months we have created a Fundraising Committee and an Events Committee, developed a system to encourage donations at Open Houses, put an annual fund appeal in the Gazette and on our website, offered sponsorship opportunities for our Open Houses, developed a plan to raise \$100,000 for an endowment and created the Old Fashioned Family Fun Day and the Great Rumford Bake Off as sponsored signature events.

3.) Increase Partnerships with Other Organizations Goals: Become actively involved with other Historical Societies and East Providence Groups; and Increase the number of school and business volunteers. In the first six months we have joined the East Providence Chamber of Commerce, attended the RHODI Conversation events held at Historical Societies around the state, developed a system to share information with Senior Centers and libraries in East Providence and surrounding areas, expanded our list of partners, explored utilizing Roger Williams Community Projects Opportunities and identified area schools and projects for community service opportunities.

4.) Expand Education Programming

Goals: Maximize use of the Education Center; and Increase programming with local schools.

In the first six months we have established an Education Committee, created a curriculum, contacted a school for a pilot education program this May, encouraged other groups to use the Education Center for their meetings and moved the library to the Education Center.

5.) Maximize Use of Technology

Goals: Streamline processes for joining as members, paying membership dues and communicating with membership and the community.

In the first six months we have updated our website, utilized email campaign software, streamlined our social media posts and obtained wireless Internet service for the John Hunt House and the Education Center.


