




ANNUAL PASTA SUPPER

The accompanying photo is actually a postcard from our growing postcard collection. It was donated a few years ago by **Kit Rodman**, a member of our Museum Committee. The year is about 1929 when the Perry family had gone for the day to Crescent park. Kit (then Perry) and her brother Edward were taken for a walk down the midway by their sitter, Melia. They came upon a booth where you could sit behind a cardboard canoe and be photographed so that it appeared that you were riding in the canoe. Melia is at the helm. Edward Perry, known as Pete, is in the middle. Kit is in the back wearing the beautiful hair bow. The background is a large poster resembling the beach and river off the Riverside shore. 
